#### "Let's cut to the chase."

- Retrain your mind social media, in project work, doesn't necessarily include Instagram, Facebook, Twitter, etc.
- Any interface that allows users to create and share content or communicate and network with each other qualifies as a social media platform!
- Going away anytime soon? Nope.
- Solution? Grow, adapt & adopt where/when you can.
- Can be a huge asset or a huge pain in the rearyou decide & determine parameters of use.

## 3 (hypothetical) disadvantages

- Distractions
- Information shared too broadly
- Too much information

Noting that they are "hypothetical" or potential disadvantages, but really these are dependent on your team, your ability to manage, work-load, general understanding of SOPs and adhering to them.

#### 3 (possible) benefits

- Improved communication
- Greater access to documents & files
- Better project monitoring

Noting, again, that these are possible benefits as they hinge greatly on your utilization of the social media platforms that you're incorporating & ensuring that information is available and consistently communicated. Communication is key!

#### **One-size fits all?**

- Has its drawbacks, but its advantages are too valuable not to be at least explored & scaled to fit your needs.
- Doesn't have to be used for everything, though.
- Learning curve? Yes, but not as steep as you'd imagine.
- When does it make sense for my project? When is it not right for me?

## Situations where it makes sense

- Complex projects with many interlocking, interwoven parts and layers.
- Projects that use or require a lot of documentation.
- Game-planning against the unforeseen problems you've experienced with past projects.

#### ...and where it may not be the right fit.

- ► Your team is small or your resources are limited.
- It's a simple project that you've got down to a science.
- Tried it, but it's just not working? Shut it down and evaluate what went wrong, where, when, how & why.

## Solutions with social capabilities

- Curious? Lots of easy-to-learn, inexpensive (sometimes free!) options to get started.
- Team communication: <u>Slack</u> no Finnish
- Project management: <u>Trello</u> (Kanban-style) in Finnish, too!
- Lots of integration possibilities (free & paid):
  - Slack apps
  - ▶ <u>Trello Power-Ups</u>

**Pro opinion**: Slack & Trello work together beautifully!
