Specific Challenge/Destination:

This call for proposals will contribute to responding to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic, by promoting ways to mainstream and embed children's rights in the responses to this and any other emergency situations. In parallel, it will promote gender-sensitive responses to the different needs of children following from or heightened by the Covid-19 pandemic. It will also contribute to the implementation of the actions put forward by the EU Strategy on the rights of the child.

Expected Outcomes and Impacts:

- 1. Increased knowledge about the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on children, as well as of the public policy responses taken and lessons learnt for the future.
- 2. Design and launch of new initiatives at the local level that respond to children's needs.
- 3. Establishment of protocols ensuring mainstreaming, safeguarding of the rights of the child and by extension promoting gender equality, and supporting children with gender-responsive actions in emergency situations in the future.
- 4. Increased child participation in decision making processes in emergency situations.
- 5. Increased stability of child specific and gender-responsive services during the emergency situations.
- 6. Established or adapted mechanisms supporting well-being of children, their needs and mental health difficulties arising from the Covid-19 pandemic.











Scope (actions):

There is a wealth of research on the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on children, many of which included voices of children on the matter. Children reported suffering from social isolation, limited possibilities to interact with peers and participate in activities. The results of such research pointed to the fact that children themselves were very rarely or not at all consulted on the measures related to the coronavirus that had a direct impact on children's lives. The situation is even worse if we look at the implementation of such measures (restriction in unsupervised movement after certain hours, online schooling, closure of after school activities, etc.).

The objective of the call is to establish, improve and provide an adequate framework for new and existing mechanisms of child participation at local level. In the establishment, improvement and provision of that framework gender-balanced and age-diversified representation of children should be ensured. Furthermore, the call aims to design concrete actions and activities that will reply to children's needs in time of the pandemic and emergency.

In particular, the call aims at (1) including children in the decision making process about responses to the pandemic measures; (2) identifying, in cooperation with children, what activities and services have been mostly affected and (3) involving children in creating mechanisms to support their needs in order to overcome the negative impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.

For example children may identify that the cancellation of the summer camp or school trip has a big negative impact on them and they could propose another way of spending time, which is in line with the local safety measures. Another situation <u>may</u> be the need to adapt public services of a municipality to protect children's health, safety and integrity in situations of vulnerability which stems from lockdowns and school closures. Measure <u>may</u> also include, as an example, reshaping after-school activities. The actions <u>may</u> include setting up or building capacity for support centres at schools, updates of existing support services, peer support groups, etc.

<u>Consultations with children may</u> take the form of focus groups on the impact, online surveys, school discussions, meetings of a local child council that would lead to developing public policies together with children in different sectors, e.g. public sector, education, health sector etc

The design and implementation of actions should be done in cooperation with children, to make sure that the action is well tailored and replies to children's needs. All actions and activities, both at design, consultation and implementation phase, shall ensure that actions are adequate, to the age and gender specific needs of children.

It is strongly encouraged to involve a public authority, including regional and local authorities, to actively participate in the projects. This requirement will be assessed under award criterion "Quality" of the proposed action.

Applying organisations are encouraged to use, disseminate and build on already existing materials (e.g tools, projects' deliverables, handbooks, research, studies, mapping exercises, reports, etc)..

→ Each project should result in a concrete new or adapted action that would derive directly from consultations with children and involve them in the implementation.

Consortium composition

Proposals must be submitted by a consortium of at least 2 organisations (beneficiaries; not affiliated entities)

Eligible activities

Eligible activities are the ones set out in section 2 above.

Projects must comply with EU policy interests and priorities (such as environment, social, security, industrial and trade policy, etc). Financial support to third parties is not allowed.

Geographic location (target countries)

Proposals must relate to activities taking place in the eligible countries (see above).

Duration











Projects should normally range between 12 and 24 months (extensions are possible, if duly justified and through an amendment).

Ethics and EU values → Minors, challenged and vulnerable groups

Projects must comply with:

- ethical principles
- EU values based on Article 2 of the Treaty on the European Union and Article 21 of the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights and
- other applicable EU, international and national law (including the General Data...
